

SPECIAL WORK SESSION CITY COUNCIL MEETING ~ JUNE 1, 2020

1. **CALL TO ORDER**

The special work session City Council meeting of the City of Little Falls was called to order by Council President Hircock on Monday, June 1, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom video conference under Minnesota Statutes 13D.021, due to the Covid-19 health pandemic. On a roll call, Councilmembers Knafla, Liljegren, Lundberg, Storlie, Hanson, Gosiak, Council President Hircock, and Mayor Zylka were present. It was determined there was a quorum.

2. **PUBLIC FORUM**

4. **CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS DISCUSSION**

5. **COUNCIL INFORMATIONAL ONLY ITEMS**

a. **Governor's Executive Order** – Councilmember Lundberg discussed that she believed that a letter received from Jeff and Michelle Waldvogel of Hilmerson Collison Center and a letter sent by Mayor and the Council President warranted discussion by full City Council; and felt like decisions were made by the Mayor and Council President without input from the rest of the City Council. No action taken.

b. **Bid Results, Public Improvements 383 and 386** – The Public Works Director/Engineer reviewed the bids received for both the 2020 improvement projects and Sunrise Addition 3. These two items are on the regular agenda for consideration.

c. **Recycling Agreement Request to Extend, City Sanitary Service** – City Administrator Radermacher reviewed that City Sanitary Service is requesting the negotiation of an extension of the current Recycling Agreement which expires on December 31, 2021. Following discussions, it was the consensus of the City Council to not negotiate at this time.

d. **Dining, Golf Course Clubhouse** – City Administrator Radermacher reviewed that with the Governor's Executive Order 2020-63, the Clubhouse will begin to have meal service on the deck. No action taken.

e. **Roger and Louise Walter Sewer Claim** – Councilmember Gosiak, Public Works Director/Engineer Kimman and Finance Officer Kasella reviewed that Roger and Louise Walter's sewer line was damaged when Minnesota Power reinstalled a power pole as a part of the trail roadway improvements. Following discussions, no action taken.
