1. **CALL TO ORDER**

3. **Golf Equipment** – City Administrator Radermacher reported he received correspondences that an anonymous donor would like to purchase a Toro Pro Force Blower for the Golf Course and he asked that this item be added to the agenda for consideration. It was the consensus of the City Council to add this item.
